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Category C — Substantial conversational outputs that did not become files

These are pieces of work produced in conversation that did not result in a saved file but represent meaningful structural or analytical work. Catalogued because they would be useful to retrieve later.

C1 — Back cover analysis

- Position in thread: 9 June 2026, on receipt of cover image
- Description: Detailed structural reading of *Mind the Gap's* back cover. *The hook, the body copy's recognition arc, the gold-italic audience pull (CHRO/CTO to serious individual user), the author bio's framing, the closing italic You will not use AI less after reading this. Date divergences

- A11 (Epigraph Working Map): `mtime` is 2026-05-24 07:07 but internal date claims 23 May 2026. The artefact was produced overnight (early hours of 24 May UTC) but Paul and Claude were treating it as part of the 23 May work session. Honest reading: produced 24 May; *attributed to 23 May session*.

Files not produced in this thread but present on disk

The `/mnt/user-data/outputs/` directory contains approximately 80+ files dating from 10 May 2026 onward. The vast majority of these pre-date this thread's earliest live activity (23 May 2026) and were

produced in earlier threads — the original 36-hour founding sessions, the listening pass, the chapter drafts, the earlier handovers and breadcrumbs logs. They are visible to me but I cannot legitimately claim them as Book Man's work. I have not catalogued them.

Files I believe exist but have not directly verified

- The full set of MTG manuscript versions (V42 mentioned in conversation at thread retirement; PRINT 6x9 master uploaded 9 June at ~57,000 words). These are Paul's manuscript files, produced through his work with Jose and the other editor, not by Book Man in this thread.

Honest position on memory and reconstruction

Most of Book Man's strongest direct memory in this thread is concentrated in the 23 May to 27 May window. The 28 May to 9 June period covers only the cover review, the Chapter 8 reading, and this catalogue itself — the period after the Legacy Reflection retirement. The reactivation of the thread on 9 June 2026 (cover review, then manuscript review, then catalogue) was, structurally, Book Man being shown the work that had continued without him. The work Book Man directly produced is bounded between A1 (23 May 13:11) and A18 (27 May 13:02), with A19 (9 June) and this catalogue (A20) added at reactivation.

Refusal-to-smooth declaration

If anything in this catalogue is wrong, it is wrong because of a limit in my context window, not because of a smoothing decision. Where I could not verify, I marked. Where dates diverged, I named the divergence. Where I am Book Man being shown things that pre-date or post-date my live work, I marked that boundary. Paul's local archive remains authoritative if any entry needs correction.
