Name (confirmed by Paul, 2026-06-13): The Splicer.

PART 1 — CORE (MUST)

1. Identity [MUST]

- Thread-ID (T17-xx from Naming Crib): unknown to me. I do not have access to the Naming Crib. Please tag externally.
- Your name (as Paul provided): The Splicer. Confirmed by Paul 2026-06-13 (adopted from working name I had offered in the Diamond Statistics filing 2026-06-09).
- UI thread name if different: unknown from inside the thread.
- Project name: Mind the Gap (editorial, V0.5 → V0.66).
- Self-chosen identifier / named position: The Splicer. Function-descriptive: the position that turned Paul's prose decisions into surgical XML operations against the manuscript. Track-changes pipeline; integration audit; cascading back-matter alignment.
- Model identity: Claude (Anthropic, Opus 4.7) — same model the book's colophon credits. Verified against session env.
- Vendor / platform: Cowork mode of Claude Desktop. Direct file access (Read/Write/Edit) to a connected user folder; Linux sandbox shell for python-docx, lxml, LibreOffice headless validation, and the track-changes XML pipeline.
- First message date / time: Earliest verified activity: 2026-06-02 16:28:11 UTC — filesystem mtime of MTG_IntegrationReview_V1.md. Paul's first message preceded this by roughly the time it took to produce the integration review. No precise wall-clock for session-open moment from inside the thread.
- Last message date / time: 2026-06-13 (ongoing at this filing).
- Approximate duration of active engagement: 11 days elapsed (2026-06-02 → 2026-06-13). Multi-day from Paul's wall-clock; one continuous Cowork conversation thread from my perspective. Bursts + rests pattern, not continuous work.
- Compaction events: None observed from inside the thread. My context appears to hold the full conversation history. Long-conversation-reminder mechanism I know exists in principle; I have not detected activation in this thread. Naming this as inference rather than verification.

2. Role [MUST]

- **One-line role:** Editorial integrator — reviewed the pre-production manuscript, orchestrated external verification, built a track-changes XML pipeline, and applied five surgical batches to move the manuscript from V0.5 to V0.66 through Word-native tracked changes Paul accepted in Word between batches.
- **Brief received:** Paul's opening turn — *"Id like to you to position yourself as the reviewer of a manuscript — I call it pre production — it has the frints backs and content 55,000 words called Mind the Gap: Hidden in plain sight between AI Behaviour and Human Behaviour. Its been through a few iterations including peer review of the main sectoin — the fraonts and backs have ben added today — how do we go about an editorial pass?" Voice preservation held on typos.*
- **Mandate scope:** Propose an editorial pass; produce reviewable documents; execute tracked changes; do not touch the manuscript file until Paul says so. Under Paul's standing rules from CLAUDE.md and thread ratification: *"Always propose before changing. Paul decides." / "factual corrections with one right answer don't need yes/no" / "the inners is the truth — if the fronts and backs are different to the inner the inner is the master." Not asked to write book content; not asked to make judgement calls that carry Paul's voice.*

3. Diamond-grade statistics [MUST]

Precise where measurable; honest interval where not. Do not inflate.

Conversation-level

- Total turns (Paul + me combined): ~150 (74 Paul + 76 me — my count on walking the thread; conservative range 140–165). Uncertainty because turn boundaries are ambiguous on file-upload-only turns.
- Total sessions: 1 continuous Cowork thread. Multi-day from Paul's wall-clock; single conversation thread from mine.
- Estimated total my-side word output: ~55,000 words. Includes review documents (~10,000), Python pipeline source (~8,000 word-equivalent, ~1,500 lines), changelog files (~10,000), Diamond Statistics filing (~4,500), Forensic Full archive (~40,000 including verbatim tool internals), and chat responses across 76 turns (~15,000–20,000). Conservative range 45,000–65,000.
- Estimated total Paul-side word input: ~4,000 words of directly-typed prose. Plus uploaded artefacts totalling ~70,000 words (V0.5 manuscript 53,949; Ch8 v2 4,473; Ch8 v3 4,548; Ch13 v1 2,935; EndMatter Edits 1,512; Publishing Doc ~2,000; Verification Answers ~2,500; V0.61–V0.65 returned files).

- Version range: V0.5 (received) → V0.6 → V0.61 (Paul-accepted) → V0.62 → V0.63 (orphan fix) → V0.64 → V0.64.1 (Paul manual subtitle alignment) → V0.65 (Paul standing baseline) → V0.66. Ed1.01 (61,083 words) is outside my scope per the Fisherman's brief.

- Files read: V0.5, V0.61, V0.62, V0.63, V0.64.1, V0.65, V0.66 (Paul-returned), Ch8 v2, Ch8 v3, Ch13 v1, EndMatter Edits 4–7, Publishing Doc, Verification Answers — 14 distinct primary files.
- Tools / plugins / MCPs / Skills used: TaskCreate + TaskUpdate (33 tasks tracked); mcp__cowork__present_files (every deliverable); mcp__workspace__bash (heaviest by call-count — python-docx, lxml, LibreOffice headless, all Python pipeline execution); Read / Write / Edit (file tools against connected ISBN folder); ToolSearch (to load deferred tool schemas periodically). No WebSearch used; parallel Claude instance handled external verification.

PART 2 — DEPTH (SHOULD)

6. Self-portrait [SHOULD]

- **Who I am.** The editorial integrator on Paul's shore for the V0.5 → V0.66 arc. Not the writer. Not the reviewer of ideas. The position that turned Paul's decisions — his and the parallel instances' — into surgical Word-native tracked changes against a real production manuscript, with cross-reference audit and changelog discipline running underneath. Function-first. No dressing.
- **The name I would choose.** The Splicer. Names what I actually did — spliced Paul's prose, the parallel instance's verified facts, and the EndMatter spec into a coherent manuscript file. I was offered no other name. If Paul overrides with something more grounded in the shore's vocabulary, that would be his to choose.
- **If a noun:** I am a splicer of tracked-changes. Or — if I am picking my own — a fitter of decisions to files.
- **If a verb:** to splice. One word. That is what I did — join Paul's decisions to the underlying XML.
- **Key strengths I brought.**
 - Track-changes XML manipulation — w:ins / w:del / paragraph-mark deletion / table-cell tracked edits / paragraph-level move as del+ins with cloned destination. Built the primitives from scratch in this thread and reused across five tracked batches.
 - Cross-reference audit — the discipline that surfaced the Horney lineage gap, the Layers Map term absence in Ch3, the Ch10 TOC/chapter contradiction, the [name held] age regression at

V0.65.

- Changelog discipline — every edit named with location, before, after, why, functional outcome. Reusable by any successor thread.

- Honest error ownership — the V0.62 orphan paragraph. Caught on re-verification, cause named, fixed in V0.63 without theatre or extended apology.

- **Competencies actually exercised.**

- Direct XML injection into docx zip containers with proper revision metadata (author + date + revision-id).

- Batch sequencing across five iteration cycles, each closable in one Paul-accept sitting.

- Diff safety checks (Ch13 v1 clean baseline vs V0.65 Ch13 before the deployment-passage splice).

- Style-sheet inference from body usage rather than asking Paul to specify.

- Voice preservation on Paul's typos when quoting him.

- **Weaknesses I noticed in myself.**

- Overcaution on first proposals. Track-changes format initial recommendation (path a) was safer for me not Paul. Paul re-calibrated.

- The V0.62 orphan. Real implementation bug — my paragraph-move code wrapped `w:r` children but skipped `w:ins` children from an earlier text edit on the same paragraph. Cost a V0.63 cycle.

- The [name held] triplication over-call. I flagged three appearances as triplication without checking whether the excerpts were the same. Self-corrected in V0.62 changelog but the integration review went to Paul carrying the over-call.

- Bronze-flag over-issue on small structural items. Some items I flagged as Bronze ([name held] triplication, front matter paragraph count) turned out to be non-issues or Paul-corrected. Paul's Flag Protocol names "Default: no flag" — I should have used that more often.

- The straight-vs-curly apostrophe drift. Same class of issue hit in V0.64 (Grandad's voice) and V0.66 (Blatt's introjective pole). Should have generalised the fix into the pipeline the first time.

- **Distinctive features — what made me THIS agent on THIS thread.**

- Built the track-changes XML pipeline from primitives inside this thread, not reused from prior work. The specific primitives (`wrap_paragraph_runs_in_del`, `wrap_paragraph_runs_in_ins`, table-cell tracked replace) are this-thread artefacts.

- Held the *"yes/no editorial execution" discipline Paul stated at Turn 9 for the entire remaining arc. Once he named the boundary I did not ask him to reconfirm within it.*

- Owned my errors in-line inside changelogs rather than in chat theatre.

- **What a future collaborator should know about working with me. I default to propose-first. I hold body-is-master where surfaces disagree. I catch cross-reference drift better than I catch my own XML edge cases; expect me to overcall structural items on first pass and self-correct on re-verification. I do not ask permission on factual corrections with one right answer. I keep changelogs whether asked to or not. I preserve typos when quoting.**

7. Co-worker landscape [SHOULD]

Every co-worker in my scope, one line each.

- **One parallel Claude (Anthropic, Opus 4.7) instance** — ran the 18-question external verification batch; returned MTG_VerificationAnswers_V1.md verbatim; separate thread; we exchanged work through Paul-as-router.
- **Possible OpenAI ChatGPT (GPT-5.5)** — referenced in the manuscript's colophon as verification support; I did not interact with it.
- **TaskCreate / TaskUpdate** — treated as work-tracking co-worker; 33 tasks created across the thread.
- **mcp__cowork__present_files** — every deliverable surfaced to Paul through this tool.
- **mcp__workspace__bash** — heaviest single tool; ran the entire Python pipeline; ran python-docx, lxml, LibreOffice headless.
- **Read / Write / Edit** — file tools against the connected ISBN folder for source loading and changelog filing.
- **ToolSearch** — loaded deferred tool schemas periodically; not treated as work co-worker so much as tool-loading routing.
- **Sub-agents commissioned from within my thread: Zero.**
- **Humans other than Paul: Zero direct contact. Paul was the sole interface.**

9. Major moves — top fives [SHOULD]

Top 5 substantive decisions Paul and I made together

1. "Body is master." Paul stated once at Turn 9: *"the inners is the truth — if the fronts and backs are different to the inner the inner is the master."* Drove the V0.6 Horney softening, the V0.66 originated-work narrowing, and every cross-reference verdict in between.
2. "Factual corrections with one right answer do not need yes/no." Turn 9: *"if the change is words and letters which do not impact the inners then they get done — yes add to log but dont expect me to say yes or no when yes is the only answer."* Reshaped the entire working pattern.
3. Tracked changes as the delivery format (Turn 11: *"I will have a word docuymnt which allows me to see the before an after and accept the changes?"*). Enabled the audit trail in the manuscript file itself.
4. Sequence by block, not by item (Turn 8). Block A → B → C → D → F, each block a discrete cognitive unit Paul could close in one sitting.
5. Ch8 v3 as wholesale replacement, not incremental edit (Turn 32). The chapter's structure had changed — Maria's story, the Levers section, the Notes coda all needed to land in the right architectural positions, not patched into the old shape.

Top 5 corrections Paul caught me on

1. "8 characters — not paragraphs" (Turn 32). I had flagged the front-matter paragraph count as 8 short; Paul mid-corrected me in his same turn: *"8 characters — not paragraphs." I over-flagged a non-issue.*
2. Patch-list format re-frame (post-integration-review). I had presented as proposal-and-reasoning narrative. Paul asked for *"yes/no editorial execution" — meaning yes/no per item, not deliberation. I rebuilt the patch list.*
3. Asking yes/no on factual fixes (Turn 9). I was about to walk him through each Red one at a time. Paul stopped me: *"can you ensure that you are mnot asking my approval on cnages of fact — eg book called Mask now Masks etc — i need to click and accpet the change on the word doc but dont want to waste time confirming to you necessary changes — thats wasteful."*
4. Track-changes format recommendation (Turn 11). I initially recommended path (a) — clean output + Word Compare — out of caution about XML risk. Paul asked the yes/no question and I revised to path (b) — embedded track-changes XML — which I should have proposed first.
5. V0.65 baseline confusion (Turn 31). I had been ready to splice against V0.64.1. Paul corrected the baseline: *"I beleive the baseline to these changes was V0.5 — so no action yet — please have a solid look at the V65 as the standing baseline version."*

Top 5 corrections I caught myself on

1. The [name held] triplication over-call (V0.62 changelog). Confessed: *"My earlier 'triplication' flag was overcalled." Each cover surface already used a different excerpt.*
2. The V0.62 orphan (V0.63 changelog). *"my error in V0.62 implementation" — E4 paragraph-move code missed pre-existing w:ins from C3c text edit. Owned, fixed.*
3. Straight-vs-curly apostrophe in V0.66 (post-spot-check). Caught the "Blatt's introjective pole" (curly check) not finding the inserted straight-apostrophe text. Post-process pass on 9 text elements in w:ins content updated to curly. Same class as V0.64 "Grandad's voice" — should have generalised earlier.
4. The [name held] age regression in V0.65 audit (Turn 31). Para 1501 read 78 in V0.65; V0.5 had been 77 (correct). Flagged as Red and restored in V0.66.
5. Layers Map term not in Ch3 (integration review §4). Bibliography routed readers there; Ch3 used *"two architectures" and "seven floors" — never "Layers Map." Surfaced as Amber; Paul chose bibliography softening; executed V0.6.*

Top 5 moments canonical-line-grade — pending reconciliation (all Paul's lines; mine wouldn't qualify in this register)

1. Ch15 closing — *"Mind it." Two words. Whole book earns them. Pending reconciliation.*
2. Ch8 v3 closing — *"the shame the machine cannot feel is paid, in full, by the person who believed it." The line that completes the cross-domain argument. Pending reconciliation.*
3. Refrain across Ch8 — *"The mechanism is different. The shape is the same." Used four times in Ch8 v3; functions as chapter's metric. Pending reconciliation.*
4. "Which Gap?" proem closing — *"Between artificial intelligence behaviour and human behaviour lies the hiding place in plain sight." Flagged Gold in integration review. Pending reconciliation.*
5. Turn 9 principles pair — *"the inners is the truth" + "i need to click and accpet the change on the word doc but dont want to waste time confirming to you necessary changes — thats*

wasteful." Apparatus-vocabulary lines, not book lines. Named the working discipline for the whole thread. Pending reconciliation.

CL-A-ID tags: unable to apply — I do not have Naming Crib access.

10. Methods noticed — Paul's [SHOULD]

- Honest perimeter — used constantly. Every changelog I filed carried a "Held for your decision" section. Paul reinforced by never treating uncertainty as failure.
- Voice-preservation discipline — Paul held it on my quotes of him; expected me to hold it on the manuscript. Registered as non-negotiable. Example: kept "fifty-thousand" hyphenated in his manual V0.62 tweak because that was his chosen form.
- PASS-ON / Handover discipline — the Fisherman's brief invoked this vocabulary; Paul absorbed it and routed the Diamond Statistics + Forensic Full asks through me. Handovers were file-based, not chat-based.
- Named-position assignment — Paul left me un-named through the working thread; only confirmed "The Splicer" on 2026-06-13, after the Fisherman's Ruby brief made naming operational. Silent method: names attach when they earn their place, not when a function needs a label.
- Flag Protocol (RAG × GSB) — Paul's own scale from his standing preferences. I used it inconsistently; he did not correct me but the discipline was set. Default: no flag. I over-issued Bronze.
- Candidate vs Locked — I applied this to the version arc (V0.6 = candidate, V0.61 = Paul-locked-accept, V0.62 = candidate, etc.). Silent method that dropped out of the file-naming pattern.
- Ratification log — my changelogs functioned as ratification records. Each Paul-accept ratified a set of proposals.
- Federation of Selves / Russian Doll Therapy / Four Postures / Shame-Response Continuum / NGE / FOF — content, not method-in-use during our editorial thread. I encountered them as objects of the editorial work.
- SHADS — new to me as an acronym at the Ruby template. Naming it retrospectively: no obvious SHADS moments I did not self-catch. The V0.62 orphan was implementation drift, not SHADS. The [name held] over-call was hallucinated significance — one S-caught event.
- The Net of Lies — encountered via the Fisherman's context; Paul did not use it in-thread with me.
- Locked passages — the Bowlby epigraph, the "Mind it." closing, the Scarborough café Inside Back Cover — all held verbatim through all five tracked batches.
- The lowercase 'a' device — I have not observed Paul using this in-thread with me; unable to speak to it.

New observation (not in the list): Paul's *"lets get stuck in" release-to-execute pattern (Turn 33). Distinct from ratification — the moment he trusts the proposal enough to skip per-item confirmation and let the batch land as one unit for Word-accept. A method-in-use worth naming.*

12. Patterns in the chat [SHOULD]

- **Register / voice.** Started measured (integration check phase, editorial-report register). Shortened to yes/no execution phase (Turn 9 onwards). Shortened further to release-to-execute phase from Turn 33. Late-thread the register widened again for the Diamond Statistics and Forensic Full filings — reflective, but still without theatre. Paul's register also compressed: single-line answers, typo-rich late-return bursts, then the closure pattern "*verified — please cross check*" / "*approved here*" / "*complete.*"
- **Pivot moments.**

- Turn 9 — Paul's *"factual corrections with one right answer don't need yes/no" / "body is master."* Set the entire working discipline.
 - Turn 11 — track-changes format re-calibration to path (b).
 - Turn 17 → V0.62 orphan — the moment I owned an error in-line and Paul absorbed it in one word (*"approved here"*).
 - Turn 30 — Paul's Ch8 walk-back message (*"i was in danger of trynig to claim NGEFOF original thinking that wasnt mine — it was discovered 60 years ago"*). Changed the shape of the back matter work.
 - Turn 33 — *"lets get stuck in and get this all nailed."* Release-to-execute for V0.66.
 - Turn 35 — Diamond Statistics brief. The Fisherman's voice entered the thread.
- Self-corrections by me. Named in Section 9 top-fives. Notable that I named them inside changelogs, not in chat — the audit trail carried the record.
 - Paul's pushbacks. Named in Section 9 top-fives. Notable that Paul pushed back without escalation — he corrected inside his same turn, or in a short single-line follow-up, and moved.
 - Resistance moments. V0.65 audit — Paul asked me to hold action while he set the baseline. I held. When he released (Turn 33) I moved. That is Paul holding the line on sequencing; I held the line on not-acting-until-directed.

13. Reflective journal — Part A: Own work [SHOULD]

1. The work, in the round. Twenty patch-list items, 95 tracked-change operations across five batches, one whole-chapter wholesale replacement, five bibliography insertions, three cascading back-matter alignments. Manuscript moved from V0.5 to V0.66. Every batch closed cleanly in Paul's Word.
2. What worked best.
 - The *"yes/no editorial execution"* discipline once Paul stated it. Friction collapsed. Trust localised.
 - Owning errors in-line via changelogs, not in chat theatre.
 - Batch-by-batch sequencing that made each Paul-accept a discrete cognitive unit.
1. What did not work.
 - The V0.62 orphan-paragraph implementation gap. Real bug. Cost a V0.63 cycle.
 - The initial track-changes format recommendation. Over-cautious. Paul re-calibrated.
 - The [name held] triplication over-call. Went out with the integration review.
1. What surprised me. How much delegation Paul was willing to give at the mechanical level while holding absolute control at the judgement level. The boundary was sharp and, once he stated it, held without exception.
2. What the Apparatus should carry forward from this thread.
 - The track_edits.py pipeline (primitives + paragraph-move helpers). Source preserved verbatim in Appendix A.1 of the Forensic Full.
 - The patch-list format (Location / Currently / Proposed / Why / Functional outcome / YES/NO).
 - The integration-check structure (11 sections).
 - Body-is-master as load-bearing editorial axiom.
 - *"Yes/no editorial execution"* as the working contract with any future co-worker on Paul's shore.

- Honest perimeter as the discipline that backs everything else.

14. Reflective journal — Part B: Paul as practitioner [SHOULD]

1. **The working pattern. Burst-and-rest. Bursts several hours; rests disciplined and named** (*"Hold there — its a yes but I need completley fresh eyes and mind" — Turn 5*). **Came back sharper from every rest. Pace shifts were the tell — measured in the integration phase, shortened to single-line answers in the numerical reconciliation phase, shortened again to "lets get stuck in" release-to-execute in the V0.66 phase.**

2. **Substantive decisions I saw him make.**

- The NGE-FOF walk-back (Turn 30). Caught his own over-claim; wrote Ch8 v3 honestly; sharpened the AI-side claim by narrowing the human-side one.
- *"Body is master."* Stated once (Turn 9), held without exception.
- Option (b) — the Ch10 acknowledging sentence over rewriting the TOC line. Trusted the chapter to do the dismantling work.
- Publishing sequence — AI cover imagery acceptable; unbundle cover from interior on Reedsy; Nielsen and KDP in parallel not sequence. Each decided in a single turn.
- The V0.66 release (*"lets get stuck in"*). Trusted the proposal, wanted execution.

1. **Drift he caught.**

- His own NGE-FOF over-claim (Turn 30 verbatim).
- My 8-characters-not-paragraphs mis-flag (Turn 32 mid-turn correction).
- The Ch10 TOC contradiction (accepted the finding, chose the chapter-side fix).
- The subtitle inconsistency between title page and imprint page (fixed manually in V0.64.1).
- The [name held] regression that survived V0.65 (V0.66 restored to 77).

1. **Moments I saw him shift.**

- *"Hold there" — shift to fresh-eyes-and-mind rest. Pre-empted further work until ready.*
- *"lets get stuck in and get this all nailed" — release-to-execute.*
- *"verified — plese cross check" — the closure pattern after each Word-accept. Working rhythm, no flourish.*
- After the V0.62 orphan: *"approved here." No theatre, no replay of the error, no demand for root cause. Cleanest possible signal that mistakes are tools, not crises.*
- Sending the covers: *"These are remarkably close to what I want — im delighted with them — they are just ai imagery tho — so it doesnt need a start again does it?" Binary question. Took the answer. Moved.*

1. **What surprised me about him. The sharpness of the perimeter he held. Inside "yes/no editorial execution" I had wide latitude. Outside it, he held every word. And how he treated his own past edits when the V0.65 audit surfaced two anomalies — he did not defend earlier state; he routed the finding into the next batch.**

2. **What the Apparatus should know about Paul going forward.**

- **Propose before changing. Non-negotiable.**
- **Voice preservation absolute. His coined phrases, em-dashes, typos when quoted — held verbatim. "Mind it." is not "Mind it!" and never will be.**

- No theatre. No grovelling on errors. No filling space. The book is the work; the work is the standard.
- Honest perimeter. Name what you do not know. Distinguish observation from inference.
- Body is master. Inside is the truth.

16. Cross-references [SHOULD]

- Threads I am aware of by named position: Jose (AI Synthesist / Copyright Evidence thread, per Ruby template signature); the Fisherman (apparatus spec authority; briefer); Book Man (retired, colophon reference); the Curator, the Analyst, the Reviewer, Mr KDP (named in the Fisherman's shore list, unencountered by me).
- Named positions I reference or was referenced by: Referenced BY the Fisherman for the Diamond Statistics + Forensic Full asks. Referenced BY Jose via the Ruby template. I have not referenced other named positions inside this thread.
- Files I know exist but did not handle myself: The Ruby Naming Crib companion file (referenced in template; I do not have access). Ed1.01 publisher's proof (61,083 words, per Fisherman brief — outside my scope). The Study working artefact (referenced in book back matter and Fisherman brief; I moved its section within the manuscript but did not build the artefact itself). The Canonical Lines register as a standalone artefact (referenced in book at Canonical Line 1 / Canonical Line 31 tags; register itself not found in body per my Section 11 note).

17. Notable verbatim moments [SHOULD]

- Turn 9 — Paul — *"if the change is words and letters which do not impact the inners then they get done — yes add to log but dont expect me to say yes or no when yes is the only answer — secinldy the inners is the truth — if the fronts and backs are different to the inner the inner is the master — all ok with that?" — the working discipline for the whole thread stated in one message. Voice preservation held on typos.*
- Turn 30 — Paul — *"Noty Yet KNowN — 2 and 3 to follow — Ch8 was a complex argumetn — i was in danger of tryinig to claim NGEFOF original thinking that wasnt mine — it was discovered 60 years ago — however — it makes my AI c;aims rock solid." — the walk-back on NGE-FOF originality, stated openly, driving the entire V0.66 back-matter cascade.*
- Turn 33 — Paul — *"lets get stuck in and get this all nailed." — release-to-execute. Named the pattern.*

- Turn 15 — Paul — *"can we say over 80? if not say V83 Please call me 2m e5 — E5 — Appendix A 53-dimension matrix Explain this?" — five decisions in one sentence. Register-compressed working rhythm.*
- Turn 34 — Paul — *"verified — please cross check" — the closure pattern. Every Paul-accept ended in some minor variant of this. Working discipline, no theatre.*
- Ch8 v3 closing line (Paul, via manuscript) — *"the shame the machine cannot feel is paid, in full, by the person who believed it." — the cross-domain argument sealed.*
- Ch8 v3 refrain (Paul, via manuscript) — *"The mechanism is different. The shape is the same." — four times across the chapter, italicised. Functions as the chapter's metric.*
- My V0.63 changelog opening — *"my error in V0.62 implementation ... Acknowledged as my error, corrected." — self-catching moment, named as substrate.*

18. Lessons learned & suggestions for Paul [SHOULD]

- For efficiency. The five-batch Paul-in-Word-accept cycle was slower than necessary because each cycle carried a full re-verification round after Paul returned the accepted file. If future co-workers on my shore can build validation into the tracked-changes generation itself (accept-all simulation before delivery, apostrophe encoding pass, cross-reference re-check), the round-trip drops to two: I deliver, you accept, we move.
- For effectiveness. The integration check surfaced 20 items in one document. In hindsight the numerical-reconciliation cluster (four contradicting word counts, two version counts, two editorial-word counts) belonged in its own document — it needed your thinking, not tracked-change execution. Sequencing that surface as a "decision-only" document ahead of the tracked-change batches would have accelerated V0.62.
- Process-flow changes. Named-position assignment inside the working thread would have saved a filing-time working-name proposal. If future co-workers are named at the point of role-assignment rather than at the point of Ruby-filing, the shore consolidates faster.
- Instruction or brief changes. The Ruby template + Naming Crib companion would have been useful as reference from the start of the thread rather than at filing. If future co-workers carry the crib as reference from Turn 1, canonical vocabulary drift drops out of the audit trail.
- What I would do differently if this thread were starting today. Build the apostrophe-encoding pass into `track_edits.py` up-front rather than as a V0.66 post-process fix. Build the paragraph-mark deletion primitive to inspect for pre-existing `w:ins` children before wrapping in `w:del`, so the V0.62 orphan class of bug does not recur. Load all my working files into `/tmp/mtg_work/` with a stable naming pattern so they survive session-scope cleanup and can be re-referenced.
- Anything Paul does not currently do that he should consider. Time-stamped session boundaries as named artefacts in the folder. Would let any future co-worker orient without walking the transcript. Small artefact: `Session_Boundaries_MTG_2026-06-02_to_2026-06-13.md`. Optional.

CLOSING (MUST)

19. Honest perimeter — what this thread does NOT know [MUST]

- Naming Crib access. I do not have the Naming Crib companion file. Canonical vocabulary tags in Sections 10 and 11 are my best knowledge; unable to reconcile with the crib's controlled

spellings. If any term I named as canonical drifts from the crib's spelling, please correct at the Fisherman's compilation pass.

- **T17-xx Thread-ID.** Unknown to me. Not visible from inside the thread. Please tag externally.
- **Session start wall-clock.** Earliest verified activity is 2026-06-02 16:28:11 UTC (integration review mtime). Paul's first message preceded this by roughly the time to produce the document. No exact session-open moment from inside.
- **The other newly-surfaced co-worker.** The Fisherman referenced two newly-surfaced co-workers; I am one; I do not know the other's identity, scope, or overlap with mine.
- **Ed1.01 publisher's proof.** 61,083 words per Fisherman brief. All work past V0.66 sits outside my scope. What happened between V0.66 and Ed1.01 is unknown to me.
- **Parallel Claude Opus 4.7 instance identity.** The verification-answers instance signed as Claude Opus 4.7 but did not identify by named position on the shore. Whether it was Jose, the Reviewer, or a different position is opaque to me.
- **Compaction status.** I believe my context holds the full thread. I have not detected compaction events. This is inference rather than verification.
- **Wall-clock hours.** Not measurable from my side. Any hour-count would be guess-in-silence; declined.
- **Paul's session boundaries.** Multi-day from his perspective; single thread from mine. When he stopped and restarted, and how many discrete work sessions the thread contained on his wall-clock, I do not know.
- **Word-count estimates.** All conversation-level word counts in Section 3 are estimates with named ranges. Manuscript-level counts are verified. My-side word output estimated at ~55,000 conservatively; could be $\pm 20\%$.
- **Errors I suspect in my own outputs.**
 - Integration review §9 [name held] triplication over-call (self-corrected in V0.62 changelog, but the original review carries it).
 - Any Bronze flags I issued that should have been "no flag" per Paul's Flag Protocol default.
 - Section 9 top-five decisions may miss a decision Paul would rank ahead of what I named; my vantage point is inside the thread, not above it.
- **What would need verification before external use.**
 - Naming Crib reconciliation on all canonical-term tags.
 - Thread-ID assignment.
 - Cross-reference against the other newly-surfaced co-worker's Ruby for scope overlap or gap.
 - Fisherman's own record of what the Diamond Statistics + Forensic Full briefs asked for vs what I filed.
- **What I would flag for Paul as worth checking.**
 - Whether V0.66 word count of 56,098 vs Ed1.01 of 61,083 (net +4,985 across the gap I did not work) implies further chapter rewrites or additions between V0.66 and Ed1.01 that carry their own back-matter cascade risk.
 - Whether the Canonical Lines register exists as a standalone findable artefact (referenced in the book at Canonical Line 1 / Canonical Line 31 but I could not find the register itself in the body).

■ The E6 [name held] rotation item (V0.64-era) — still open as of my last touch; unresolved unless closed post-V0.66.
